Executive Summary

District Strategic Plan 2025

Orange County Public Schools is the eighth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is one of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

Vision: To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

Mission: With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diverse pathways to lead our students to success.

School Collection Development Plan

SALLY RIDE ELEMENTARY serves 389 students enrolled in grades #N/A. The student population's ethnicity is 60% Hispanic and 40% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 70% White, 19% Black, 0% Native, 4% Asian, 2% Pacific, and 5% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Kahlil Ortiz and Assistant Principal Holly Watts. SALLY RIDE ELEMENTARY is proud to offer the many special programs which provide students with opportunities. These include lots of STEM and STEAM activities as we are an Aviation & Aerospace Magnet School. We have a STEM Club, Solar Club, Garden Club, PenPal Club with students from the UCF Engineering program and our fifth graders, Music Club, Art Club, Chess Club, Social Skills Club and a Sunshine State Book Club. We also have an Exceptional Student Education (ESE) unit of intellectually underdeveloped and physically challenged students.

A thorough analysis of the current media center collection at SALLY RIDE ELEMENTARY indicates that the average age of the collection is 2010 and the number of books per student is 28. The American Association for School Libraries has established a criteria for highly effective media centers that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection. At this time, SALLY RIDE ELEMENTARY does meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student.

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- According to the Titlewise analysis, 34% of the collection is aged so I need to focus on weeding this school year and updating non-fiction titles.
- Our collection is currently 99% print titles so we need to add more digital titles. Through the district, our students do have access to 1,329 titles in Sora and 1,108 titles in Destiny.
- The Science and Technology books in our collection have a higher average publication date, to accentuate our Magnet program; however some titles still need to be weeded out.
- The Graphic Novels section is growing due to the popularity of this genre of books (grew by 50 books this year).
- Hispanic students are 60% of the school's population; however, we only have 124 titles or 1% of our collection reflecting their culture. We need to improve in this area.
- Weeding is a constant process and when completed the average age of the collection will greatly improve.

Comparison between 2021-22 and 2022-23 Testing Data

(adapted from https://www.fldoe.org/accountability/assessments/k-12-student-assessment/results/2023.stml) In 2023, the state transitioned from Florida Standards Assessments (FSA) to Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FSAT) for English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics. The 2022-23 for FAST and Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) End-of-Course (EOC) assessments are based on **provisional** achievement level cuts that are linked to each assessment's respective 2021-22 reporting scale. Comparisons should not be made between the 2023 data and previous years' data. The implementation of FAST K-2 in the 2022-23 school year was the first administration of statewide assessments for students in grades K-2. These assessments include Star Early Literacy Proficiency, Star Reading Proficiency, and Star Math Proficiency.

Collection Analysis

The collection is developed for and influenced by students, their interests, academic needs and alignment to the curriculum. The data below is a snapshot of the collection based on a Titlewise Analysis from July 2023. Purchasing or weeding after that time is not reflected in this data.

To deepen focus on strategic collection development, specific sections of the collection were analyzed in detail to determine whether the media center collection reflects and represents various points of view and experiences. The goal is to provide a balanced collection that can be both a mirror, to reflect a reader's experience, and a window, so readers can experience different viewpoints.

Based on the available school data of SALLY RIDE ELEMENTARY in comparison to Collection Analysis results, it was found that:
